

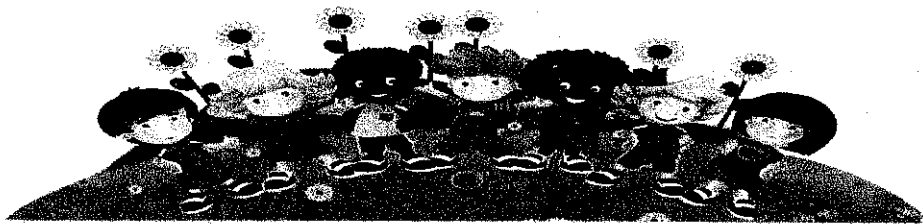
Grade 4 Supply List 2023-2024

The items on this list include those needed for special classes.

- 3-ring binder, 1.5 or 2 inch, durable or heavy duty, any color
- 3-ring binder dividers (You need 10 of these)
- 4 notebooks (1 subject, spiral bound, wide ruled: blue, green, red, yellow)
- 1 highlighter, any color
- 1 dozen erasable pens, blue or black (These may need to be replenished throughout the school year)
- 1 dozen #2 Ticonderoga pencils (Other brand names are not worth the money!)
- 2 black Sharpie markers
- 1 pack each of colored pencils, crayons, and markers
- 6 dry erase markers, blue or black
- 6 glue sticks
- Earbuds or headphones
- 1 plastic storage container with a lid to be used as supply storage. Shoebox sized boxes are perfect.
- 5 jumbo sized book socks
- 1 roll of clear contact paper (this can be used at home to cover workbooks)

To be collected for classroom use:

- 3 packs of lined index cards
- 2 containers of disinfecting wipes
- 3 boxes of tissues
- 2 packs wide-ruled looseleaf paper
- 4 reams of COPY paper (please note that this is different than “printer” paper)

Reading assignment

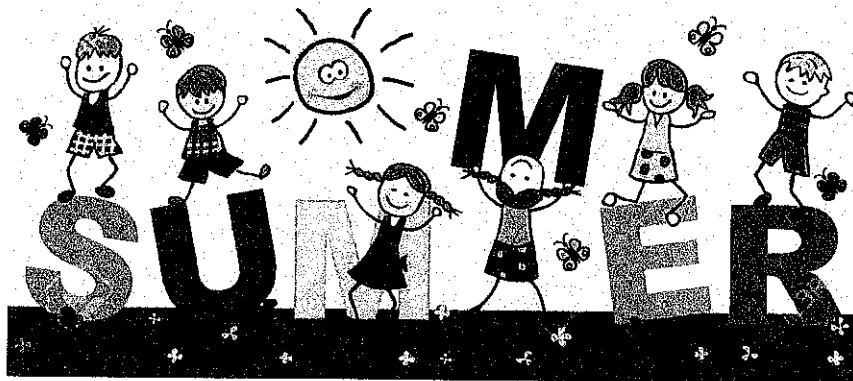
- Read the book *Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing* by Judy Blume.

Writing assignment

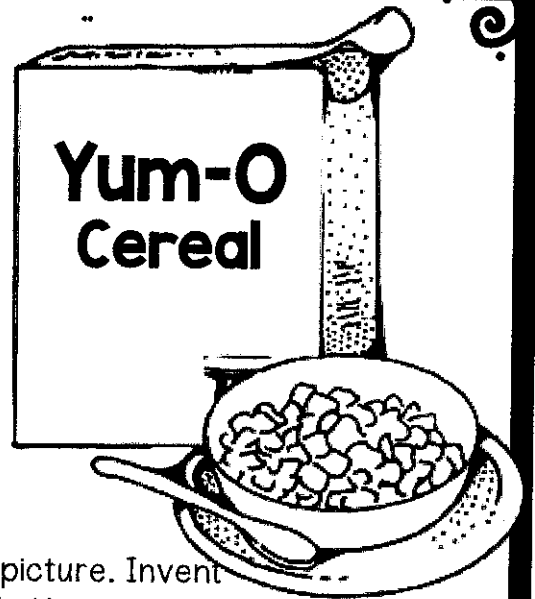

Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing Cereal Box Book Report



Your assignment is to design a cereal related to Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing. You will decorate a real cereal box with illustrations, text and even a prize inside!

Front of Box: Include the name of the cereal and a picture. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to the book, yet sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact title of the book. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all relate to the book.

Right Side: Make a list of ingredients that includes the story elements (main characters and setting). Under the heading "Ingredients," list the main characters and the setting and write a sentence about each.

Left Side: Design a game that is based on the story. It can be a puzzle, word search, word scramble, maze, crossword puzzle, hidden picture illustration, or any other fun activity. Make sure that it includes information from the book.

Back of Box: Write a one-paragraph summary that describes the main problem and the solution of the book. Try to use words that will "grab" the reader's attention and make them want to buy your cereal.

Top of Box: Include the title, author, number of pages, and the number of stars you would give the book if you were a book critic. The maximum number is 5 stars.

Prize: Your prize must be something the main character could have used in the book or something that reminds you of the main character. You must include a picture of the prize on the front of your box to let the reader know what is inside. You must actually put a prize in your box too!

Don't Forget!

Proofread carefully to avoid errors in grammar, spelling and/or punctuation. Cereal box must be colorful and creatively designed. Cereal box must be neatly assembled and written portions need to be easy to read!
