Art has the role in education of helping children become like themselves instead of like everyone else.



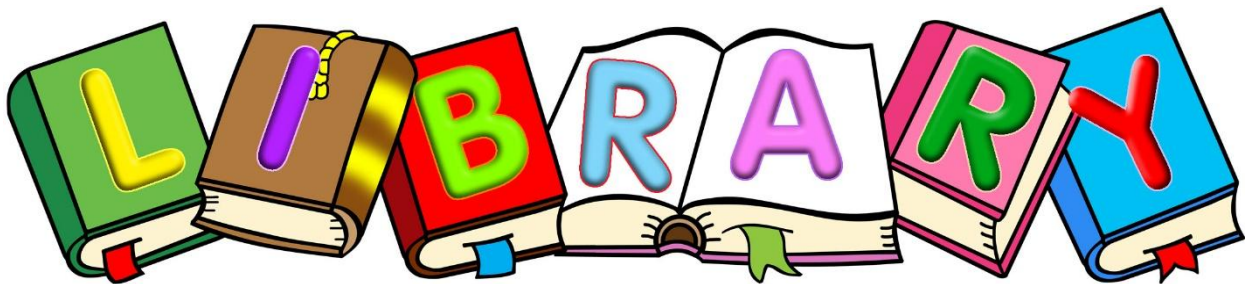
I feel so fortunate to have been given the choice to teach Art this year. It is a blessing!
